Funding for historic heritage

Building owners should explore all potential funding options. Access to funding sources, however, is often dependent on the nature of ownership of the building or its heritage status.

The National Heritage Preservation Incentive Fund

The National Heritage Preservation Incentive Fund provides funding assistance for privately-owned Category 1 historic places, wāhi tapu, wāhi tapu areas and wāhi tūpuna entered on the New Zealand Heritage List/Rārangi Kōrero under the Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014.

The fund is administered by Heritage New Zealand. for more information on the Fund see the Heritage New Zealand website:

The government, Heritage New Zealand and local authorities have established the Canterbury Earthquake Heritage Building Trust as a source of assistance for owners to repair damaged heritage buildings.
