Historic Heritage Schedules in RMA Regional and District Plans

Regional and district plans include lists of historic heritage for protection by rules. The NZHPT promotes the use of a simple historic heritage schedule structure that includes historic places (buildings and sites), historic areas, places and areas of significance to Maori, and other types of heritage (i.e. geological sites).

| Historic Places (buildings) | Group A | Places registered as Category I historic places and other nationally significant historic places. | ANZAC and Kiwi Halls, Featherston (registered Category I historic place) |
| | Group B | Places registered as Category II historic places and other non-registered places of heritage value and significance. | Natusch House, Masterton (registered Category II historic place) |
| Historic Places (Sites) | Group A | Sites (including archaeological sites) registered Category I historic places and other nationally significant historic sites | Rabbit Fence – ‘Omahu Farm’, Stronvar Road (registered Category I historic place) |
| | Group B | Sites (including archaeological sites) registered Category II historic places and other non-registered sites of heritage value and significance | Zukeika Grave, Palliser Bay (not registered) |
| Historic Areas | | Registered historic areas and other non-registered historic areas of heritage value and significance | Rimutaka Incline Rail Trail (registered historic area) |
| Places and Areas of Significance to Maori, including wahi tapu | | Registered wahi tapu and wahi tapu areas and other non-registered but significant places and areas of significance to Maori. May include recorded archaeological sites of significance to Maori | Te Maipi, Masterton (registered wahi tapu area) |
| Heritage Landscapes (see Discussion Paper No. 3) | | | |
